## AFTER HOURS

**Electro-Opera based on Martin Scorsese's film**

**world premiere: 25.08.06, 21:00 h**

For the first time, Berlin's famous clubbing mecca, "Berghain" will host a theatre production. Formerly an electric power house, "Berghain" has a raw and monumental industrial atmosphere evocative of Metropolis or the imagery of Hieronymus Bosch. At present, "Berghain" is arguably the centre of Berlin's notorious underground as every week the club holds decadent parties for thousands of guests which continue non-stop on all three floors from Friday night to Sunday evening. This is undoubtedly the perfect setting for Marcelo Buscaino and Heidi Mottl's world premiere of their electro-opera, AFTER HOURS.

Based on Martin Scorsese's cult film (After Hours / 1985 / director of photography: Michael Ballhaus), AFTER HOURS follows the dark and surreal adventures of a young computer programmer, Paul Hackett. Dissatisfied with his secure yet lonely existence, Hackett embarks on a nightmarish voyage through the urban underworld. Following a series of fatal misunderstandings and events, Hackett loses his money and becomes lost in a labyrinth of clubs, bars and darkrooms where he is eventually hunted for theft and later, murder. The way back is cut off ....

AFTER HOURS combines electronic music and opera. Berlin is distinctly the prime location to feature the world premiere of AFTER HOURS as the city is at the heart of both contemporary electronic music and opera. Although many have previously attempted to contemporize classical operas by adding techno music and a current setting, Mottl and Buscaino's approach in AFTER HOURS is innovative. Modern text is set to electronic music and the setting is contextualized to an actual underground club location. The work will be performed by actors, opera singers and dancers and for the first time, club techno music will not only be used to heighten atmosphere but also to convey a dramatic story. In doing so, Mottl and Buscaino are developing a new style of performance.

*Lohengrin*, *Carmen* and *Parsifal*. Whilst living in London, he studied singing with William MacAlpine at the Guildhall School of Music and expanded his knowledge of Graham Technique in The Place. Following his master's degree, he assisted Jean-Marc Bory in Mozart's *Lucio Silla* in Lausanne (CH) and Caen (F) and later worked as Assistant and Revival Director at the Deutsche Oper Berlin from 2001 to 2005. There he collaborated with directors such as Hans Neuenfels, Achim Freyer, David Pountney and Sebastian Baumgarten, and directed the revival of traditional and contemporary operas, e.g. *Elektra*, *Faust*, *Werther*, Verdi's *Requiem* and Janacek's *From the House of the Dead*, for which by request of the director, Volker Schlöndorff, he produced the pantomime.

Since August 2005, Buscaino has worked as a freelance and is regularly appointed to direct revivals for the Deutsche Oper Berlin. He was recently invited to Brazil by the film maker Karim Ainouz to act as Script and Directing Consultant for the feature film *Raffle Me*. In this project he captured the images for the respective *Making Of*, which he later expanded into his own filmic essay *Making Off*. In Brazil he also created the photo installation *Bem-Vindos, Berlin, CE* at the Historical Museum of Ceara, Fortaleza (BR).

Marcelo Buscaino discovered the unexplored potential of "Berghain" as a theatre setting and swiftly connected its atmosphere with the mood of Martin Scorsese's film, thus providing the creative and stylistic basis for developing AFTER HOURS into an electro-opera.

### KLAUS JANEK

born 1969, in Bolzano Italy, studies classical doublebass with M. Muraro, Venice, workshops with D.Holland, P.Kowald. L.Butch Morris.

Explores avantgarde music and works on sound research on the doublebass. Gets involved in the improvised music scene and lots of traditional and electronic music, published CD (FMP, edel classics, Minor Music, Solponticello, Ubiquity and others), in between three solo doublebass CDs. Composes music for cinema, theatre and dancetheatre. In 2004 he signs an exclusiv contract as composer with scoop music gmbH/bmg publishing. Art direction of various concertseries in Italy and GermanyHTT.T Concert and festival appearances in EU and USA.
